TOWN OF GANDER 2018 SPRING CLEAN-UP

The residential clean-up procedure is as follows:

- All streets will be completed once during each week of the clean-up period.
- Clean-up refuse will be collected on the day of your scheduled household garbage collection.
- Refuse must **not** be put out before or after the designated dates for the clean-up.

Pile 1: As per CNWM, Regular household/kitchen garbage and recyclables, in the appropriate clear or blue bag.

Pile 2: Metals, including large appliances made mostly of metal.

Pile 3: Branches, must be tied and bundled (Max. 50lb/ 5ft lengths).

Pile 4: Construction and Demolition material, wood, lumber, wooden chairs & tables, wooden dresser/desk. Nails must be removed or completely bent into wood. (Max. 50lb/ 5ft lengths).

Pile 5: All other refuse, including covered furniture, mattresses and plastic debris.

- All **loose material** (gyproc, glass, shingles, ceramic tiles, etc.) **must** be in appropriate container (max. 50lb per container).
- Broken glass and other **must** be clearly marked and properly contained.

Note the following items will not be collected:

- **Rocks, gravel or concrete**
- **Electronics** (Computer, TV's, Etc.)
- **Garden Waste** (Trees, Grass, Leaves, Etc.)
- **Hazardous waste** (Propane cylinders, Paint, Pesticides, Oil, etc.)

YEAR-ROUND DISPOSAL SERVICES

Residents are reminded that the McCurdy Drive Waste Transfer Station accepts materials on selected Saturdays throughout the year.

- **Metals** may be dropped off at Central Metals (1983) Ltd. during normal business hours.
- **Good Used Furniture** will be collected by Evangel Pentecostal Church. To arrange pick-up please call 256-4762.
- **Grass and Leaves** may be dropped at the community composting site located at 34 McCurdy Drive.
- **Trees and Branches** may be dropped at the chipping site adjacent to the Magee Road Treatment Plant.
- **Electronics** including computers, TV's, printers and monitors, along with home or personal audio/video systems and non-cellular phones, may be dropped off at Scotia Recycling, Green Depot located on Garrett Drive.
- **Paint** may be dropped at Alywards Home Hardware, located on Bennett Drive or Scotia Recycling, located on Garrett Drive.
- **Car Wreck disposal**, please call Central Metals (1983) Ltd. at 256-7780.
- **Hazardous Waste** Please contact the Norris Arm Regional Waste Management Facility at 651-2930 ext. 9 for further information.

Please note: This clean-up event is for Town of Gander residents only; contractor-generated debris or refuse brought in from other communities will not be collected.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

The Town of Gander will be hosting its Annual Household Hazardous Waste Day early in the fall of 2018. This event is free to residents and sponsored by the Central NL Waste Management. More information will be made available when the date is confirmed.

Hazardous waste includes products that are toxic, corrosive, flammable or explosive. These items can cause fires, harm people or animals, and cause damage to the environment and to machinery. They are not accepted for curbside pick-up.

You can dispose of the hazardous household materials at the proper Central Regional Waste Management Sites during regular hours of operation.

These hazardous materials should NEVER be put in the garbage or poured down the drain:
