# Town of Gander hosts the Memorial Service for the 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Arrow Air Disaster.

(Gander, NL – December 12, 2020)

The Town of Gander will be hosting a memorial service to commemorate the 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Arrow Air Disaster on Saturday, December 12<sup>th</sup> @ 1:00pm. Taking place at the Evangel Pentecostal Church, the service will be closed to the public. A wreath laying ceremony will take place at the crash site following the service.

The Memorial Service will be live streamed on <a href="www.rogerstv.com">www.rogerstv.com</a> while the wreath laying ceremony will be shown on Rogers TV at a later date.

### **BACKGROUND INFO:**

On the morning of Thursday, 12 December 1985, shortly after takeoff from Gander en route to Fort Campbell, the aircraft stalled, crashed, and burned about half a mile from the runway, killing all 248 passengers and 8 crew members on board. As of 2020, it is the deadliest aviation accident to occur on Canadian soil and the second-deadliest of any accident involving a DC-8, behind the crash of Nigeria Airways Flight 2120 six years later.

The aircraft, a McDonnell Douglas DC-8-63CF, was chartered to carry U.S. Army personnel, all members of the 101st Airborne Division, back to their base in Fort Campbell, Kentucky. They had completed a sixmonth deployment in the Sinai, in the Multinational Force and Observers peacekeeping mission and were returning home for Christmas
