





The Town of Gander cares deeply about the safety and well-being of its community members. To ensure your safety while walking on the streets at night, we would like to share some important tips to enhance visibility and reduce potential risks:

Wear Reflective Clothing: When walking in the dark, wearing reflective clothing significantly increases your visibility to drivers. Consider incorporating reflective accessories, such as vests, jackets, or even reflective tape on your clothing, to make

Carry a Flashlight: Carry a flashlight or use the flashlight feature on your smartphone to illuminate your path. This not only helps you see where you are going but also makes you

more visible to others on the road. Walk Facing Traffic: If there is no sidewalk, always walk on the side of the road facing OUR HIGH VISIBILITY oncoming traffic. This allows you to see approaching vehicles and react accordingly. Stick to Well-Lit Areas: Whenever possible, choose routes that are well-lit. Stick to streets with streetlights, and avoid poorly lit or secluded areas. Well-lit streets provide better visibility for both pedestrians and drivers. Stay Aware and Alert: Stay attentive to your surroundings and remain alert while walking at night. Avoid distractions such as texting or wearing headphones, as they can reduce your awareness of potential hazards.

Cross Streets Safely: Use crosswalks and designated pedestrian crossings when available. Wait for a safe gap in traffic

Plan Your Route: Whenever possible, plan your route and let someone know your estimated time of arrival. This way, if
